It's a trojan that drops itself into other programs when they are run, but once it's run, it will disappear. As far as I know, it's for the purpose of gathering credentials. Most likely, it's running on your machine because you're already logged in to some website, a game server, or a CAD program. You can remove it easily if you're brave (read: have some experience with malware) with Malwarebytes. Q: Select user's friends I have a Person model, and friends are Users.
